FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



The Great Leap is a vigorous and vibrant story centered entirely on the world of basketball—but amid the smack talk and free throws, brilliant playwright Lauren Yee highlights and gives voice to the Asian-American experience.

This play is inspired by Yee's father—a first-generation Chinese immigrant who grew up on the basketball courts of San Francisco's Chinatown. His experience breathes life into the character of Manford, who we watch jump, shoot, dribble, and struggle to find his place in the world. He is relentless and always reaching for more—the kind of person so many of us can see ourselves in.

I am grateful to Jessica Holt, a brave and generous director, who has led this process with open arms. We met ten years ago this fall, and it's been an honor to collaborate with her again. She's helped me assemble an out-of-this-world amazing cast, as well as an enormously talented team of designers. It has been a joy to get this show on its feet—OKC Rep's first full-scale production under my tenure.

I'll end this note by saying my absolute favorite aspect of The Great Leap is how it revolves around a group of people trying to do the impossible, even if it means standing alone. I hope it inspires you as much as it continuously inspires me.
