#### FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

\*A Brony (bro + pony) is a fan of the children's cartoon My Little Pony: Friendship is Magic who is outside the target demographic of little girls, mostly guys from their teens to 30s. Though they face a fair amount of ridicule and bullying, the phenomenon has developed a massive online presence, local meet up groups, annual Bronycons, charity organizations, and other community endeavors.

The Antelope Party will be performed with one 10-minute intermission.

#### FROM THE DIRECTOR

The Antelope Party by Eric John Meyer premiered in 2018 and has been living in my head since I first became familiar with it then. Eric's blending of pop culture comedy and cautionary political thriller is a funny, strange, and provocative mixture that is eerily timely given our current American moment, when we find ourselves embroiled once again in culture wars on multiple fronts, and the persistent beating of authoritarianism at the door.

Recognizing that the word "fan" derives from the word "fanatic," the play explores what brings people together--whether it be an earnest love for a children's TV show or a zealous worry about the loss of order in a rapidly changing world--and who we are when that human impulse to connect with others goes very, very wrong. To say any more would perhaps spoil some of the surprises of the performance ahead.



I'm very grateful to Eric for writing this exceptional play and this talented group of actors, designers, and technicians who are bringing this play to life; and I am especially grateful to Kelly Kerwin, whose vision for OKC Repertory Theater saw a space for this project in creating work that speaks to us right now.
